


CESB 2013 Annual Report

The Certification Board added the Certified Scheduling Technician (CST) certification to its portfolio on July 1, 2013 and officially accepted the 2012 beta-tested Decision & Risk Management Professional (DRMP) certification on September 1, 2013. The CST certification is designed for entry level professionals with at least 4 years of industry experience or a four year degree. The DRMP certification is designed for experienced professionals with at least 8 years of verifiable experience working in the decision and risk management area (4 years can be substituted with a college degree). The Certification Board is pleased to experience continued growth and is looking forward to greater achievement in 2014.
